How is A-Level English Literature assessed?

Exam board - Pearson Edexcel

Three exams:

- **Paper 1: Drama (two essays) - 30%**
- **Paper 2 Prose (one essay) - 20%**
- **Paper 3 - Poetry (two essays) - 30%**

One piece of coursework

- **NEA study (one 2,500-3000 word extended essay) - 20%**



- Answer one essay question comparing how a key theme is explored in the pre 1900 and post 1900 novels


What Maisie Knew – Henry James

- Study a 600-year-old narrative poem that feels surprisingly modern




Non-Examination Assessment






