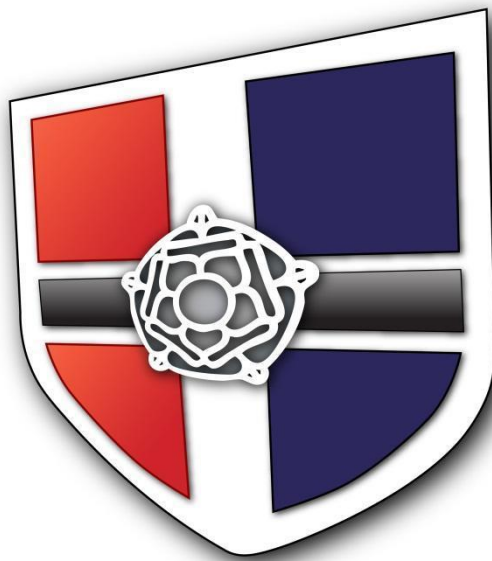

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SCHOOL UNIFORM – KS3 AND KS4

We feel it is important that all students in years 7 to 11 wear full uniform at school. We try to make sure that the uniform and PE kit are practical and good value for money; you will see that some of the items can only be bought through our nominated supplier (Sportswear International) so that we can pass on to parents the saving made by bulk purchase. Uniform is just one area in which parents can help to set high standards.

If providing any of the items causes financial difficulty, parents are asked to contact the Form Tutor, the PLL or the Parent Support Advisor at the school. All such enquiries will be treated in strict confidence.

Everything must be marked with the owner's name. A large bag will be necessary to carry everything needed for each day. Handbags are not suitable.

Uniform	Guidance
Blazer	All students must wear blazers with the school logo sewn onto the left hand pocket. No hoodies are allowed.
Jumper Optional	Students may wear a plain black jumper under their blazers. The jumper should not be worn instead of the blazer. No logos are allowed.
Trousers	Students MUST have <u>tailored trousers</u> (e.g. not skin tight/skinny, jean or legging style). Trousers must be worn around the waist (above hips – no underwear should be on show.) Buttons and zips should be functional. <u>Belts</u> – These are optional but if worn should be plain black. Tailored shorts will be permitted when the temperature is high – this will be communicated to students and parents by the Senior Leadership Team.
Skirt Optional	The only skirt permitted is a black knee length pleated skirt – this must have a zip. Lycra, mini or tight skirts are not permitted. Skirts should be worn with black/flesh colour tights or socks.
Shirt	Shirts should be plain white and tucked in. If you wish to wear a white "T" shirt underneath you can but this should not be visible
Tie	Top button to waist in length. A clip on or standard tie is available to purchase from the School Shop.
Shoes	Shoes must be plain black and flat. No logos/branding, trainers, or canvas shoes/pumps (i.e. Converse, Vans or other similar types). Boots are not allowed.
Jewellery and accessories	What is allowed: One watch. Two of small gold/silver stud earrings worn in each ear lobe (two studs per lobe). Not allowed: Body piercings, ear spacers, nose piercings, studs, lip or tongue piercings, hooped, dangly, 'Bling' or pearl earrings. The use of plasters to cover items of jewellery is not acceptable, nor is flesh/clear coloured jewellery. No rings permitted.


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Make up	Only subtle/natural looking make up is allowed. This means having a 'natural' look (e.g. no heavy foundations, black eyeliner, dark eye-shadows, bright lipsticks or blusher). Natural and nude nail varnish is permitted. Long acrylic nails or bright varnish is not permitted.
Hair	Hair should be one tone and be a natural looking colour (e.g. brown, black, blonde and natural shades of red). No streaks or block colours permitted. "Artwork" on the scalp or eyebrows is regarded as a fashion extreme and is therefore not permitted.
Coat	Outdoor coat (not denim, corduroy, leather or suede). No sportswear or hoodies are permitted. Hoodies and tracksuit tops are not outdoor coats; they must also not be worn under blazers. Outdoor coats should be removed inside.
Apron	Apron Scheme (five year inclusive), £7.00 for use in Art, Food and Design Technology. Aprons are provided in all the above areas for students to wear throughout their school career. Students not taking advantage of this scheme must provide two clean aprons for their own use.

PE KIT: Items marked * can only be bought through our uniform supplier:

- 1.* Polo shirt with Sponne badge
- 2.* Rugby shirt
- 3.* Half zip fleece with Sponne badge (compulsory for Girls in years 10 and 11 in place of the rugby shirt)
4. Black shorts or black skort
5. Long black socks
6. Short white socks
7. Trainers
8. Football boots, with safety studs
9. Shin Pads (**compulsory** for Football, Hockey and Rugby)
10. Mouth guard (optional)
11. Black / Navy joggers for cold outdoor lessons
12. Base layer – black / white / navy
13. **A large quantity of good quality second hand items are also available.**

Sixth Form Dress Code

As a member of Sponne Sixth Form you are not expected to wear a school uniform. However, you are a role model to the younger years and are expected to dress in a way that is smart and appropriate to the school environment.

Dress Code: Students can wear the following professional wear only:

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Additional Points

- No large logos or branding to be worn on any clothing
- Hairstyles should be in keeping with smart dress ethos and shouldn't be dyed excessively bright colours
- Piercings should be subtle and not excessive
- No revealing clothing to be worn

General Information

- **Sixth Form School Lanyards:** Every student is provided with a school lanyard and identification badge these **MUST BE WORN AT ALL TIMES**. Replacements will incur a cost of £5.00.

Consequences

Students that choose to attend Sponne Sixth Form automatically agree to comply with the dress code above. Should a student not adhere to the dress code, the following consequences will be put in place. Sixth Form tutors will check dress code on a daily basis.

- 1) First offence - informal student warning to rectify - not logged.
- 2) Second offence - agreed time with tutor to rectify dress code issue and this is logged on Go 4 Schools. Students given one week to sort the issue.
- 3) Third offence - tutor to contact parents and this is logged. Parents made aware of the situation - tutors refer back to the dress code document above.
- 4) Continuous non-adherence to the dress code - social and study time becomes directed time until the parent/carer meeting takes place. Parent/carer meeting with Head of Sixth Form and SLT link/Headteacher.
- 5) Persistent failure following the meeting will lead to all social and study time becoming directed time until the student adheres to the code.
