

## Fundamental British Values in Drama

<p>Individual liberty</p> 	<p>Students will have opportunities to express their own personal views throughout drama lessons; developing the awareness of how to express their views without impacting on the rights and views of others.</p>
<p>Mutual Respect</p> 	<p>The core values of mutual respect are promoted in Drama lessons to encourage participation by all. Everyone is supported to engage and express themselves through their drama creations. Ideas will be considered equally and with care for the respect of individual views.</p>
<p>Democracy</p> 	<p>Every student has an opportunity to share their ideas freely without judgement within lessons and through the exploration of set texts students are able to develop their understanding of the need to listen to a diverse range of views and respect them even if they are different from their own. Some of the creative pieces may touch on current issues which reflect modern British Society.</p>
<p>Freedom of faiths and beliefs</p> 	<p>Through set texts students are exposed to a range of views from authors of different faiths and beliefs. Students are able to express their own faiths and beliefs through creative work and are encouraged to expand their understanding of the world through reflection of the work of others.</p>
<p>The rule of law</p> 	<p>Many learning opportunities in Drama allow students to discuss British laws and through exposure to different plays, students are made aware of the changes in attitudes towards different issues such as drugs and abortion that are reflected in our laws.</p>
